FOLLOWING GOD'S CALL

“Life is a series of hellos and goodbyes. I’m afraid it’s time for goodbye again.” - Billy Joel

By now the letter announcing my resignation as Pastor of United in Christ has been received by the congregation. Being appointed as Assistant Professor of Preaching and Worship at Lexington Theological Seminary in Lexington, KY, is the culmination of many years of hard work and academic training. It is a long dream finally come true! But it does mean that my call as a parish pastor is transitioning into this new role of serving as a teacher of future pastors, preachers and worship leaders.

I have learned so much from being your pastor here at United in Christ, and in the Susquehanna Valley. As I reflect back on the last five years, I give thanks to God for all the good work we have done to continue building God’s Kingdom right here in Central Pennsylvania. It has been such a blessing to live, serve, raise our family, and enjoy the beauty of this area.

Pastor Bill Henderson, Dean of the Buffalo Valley Conference, has been in contact with Council President Bob Swartz about the transition to begin arranging for interim coverage during the pastoral vacancy. And I have met with the youth and families to begin putting together a plan to make sure our Confirmation and Youth ministries continue with strong support.

Also, there has been a change that will affect my end date. **We sold our house!** Which is good news, but because of our buyer’s situation, we need to move out the week of July 18. Which means **my last Sunday will have to be July 17**, two weeks earlier than we had originally planned.

In the meantime, we will continue to put leaders in place for the different ministries and plan for ways to fill the gaps until God sends the new pastor for this congregation. Please keep me and my family in prayer as we search for a house in Lexington and all that the move involves. And together we will be praying for the Holy Spirit to lead us all as she has continued to do all along!

Stewardship Reflection

FOUNDATIONS AND ROOFS

The following is an excerpt from our Youth Council Member who shared in a temple talk in March what has formed the foundation of his faith and how this church provides the “roof” for his continued learning and growing.

Our theme for these temple talks is “Foundations and Roofs.” A building isn’t going to be stable without a strong foundation and roof to protect itself from the harshness of the environment. It’s the same with people and their faith; they need to have a strong person or people to base their faith and then other people to support and nurture that faith. I feel I have been lucky to have both a strong foundation and roof to grow and support my faith.

I consider my foundation to be my parents. I can tell you that I would not be where I am today without them by my side. My parents started my foundation in faith by having me baptized in this church when I was five months old. When I was around two or three years old, my dad would sit next to my bed every night saying the Lord’s Prayer and teaching me every word of it. I am thankful for his patience and diligence in doing this for my faith in God. My parents have modelled prayer as an important part of my faith by having us pray before every meal together, whether it is at home or out at a restaurant. For the first two or three years when I wanted to go to Camp Mount Luther but was too young to spend the night, my mom helped take me and some of the other youth to the day camp in the morning and then picked us up in the afternoon every day for an entire week.

As I grew older my faith got a little moldy, so to speak, because I did not always want to come to church or finish Confirmation or even wanted to go to the ELCA Youth Gathering. But my mom has been able to press me to keep my foundation of faith from deteriorating. By being confirmed in this church and going to Detroit, these experiences have built my foundation back up. My faith continues to grow stronger with my mom and dad as my foundation.

Every foundation needs a roof to cover the building. That is where I see you, my church family – as my roof for my foundation of faith. You


all have made food or eaten at the turkey waffle dinner for the past ten years to help support not only me, but the other youth go to CML or the youth gathering. You have encouraged me to do well and you have been there to support me in the things that I do. I thank you for all of that stability and support!

I can't think of another church that allows their youth to be as involved in the Sunday services as our church. Over my years in this church, I have served as acolyte in the main service; even if not perfect in doing this job, you have supported me. You have allowed us as youth to lead entire services through the frequent Youth Services; allowing us to read the prayers, lessons and sermons, serve communion, sing songs we like and read our prayers from our hearts. I have read lessons and even when I have stumbled and been slow in getting the words out, you have been patient and wonderful.

In November, you believed in me enough to give me the opportunity to serve as youth representative to United in Christ Lutheran Church Council. I was interested in learning more about the internal business of the church and chose to be nominated. Even though I have only served a few months, I feel that I am learning more about the big picture of what it takes to keep our church doors open for all of us.

Every now and then there have been "leaks in the roof," such as deaths in my family and in this church family which have been emotionally sad for me. But even in the tough times, I can count on the love from my church family to patch the leaks up and restore the roof. I thank you all for your words of encouragement and prayers for my family during these times.

I do not know what will happen in the future and how the rest of my life will turn out, but I pray to God that I will continue to have my parents and my church family as supports in my faith journey. Thank you for this opportunity to share with you my feelings about my faith.

This is the fourth year that we have held the Rich Huff/Operation Santa Claus benefit Chinese and Silent Auction. We have been so happy each year that this cause, which benefits needy children in the Mifflinburg, Lewisburg, Selinsgrove, Milton and Warrior Run communities, has been so well supported. Each year we have increased in items donated by individuals and businesses. Each year our income from this project has increased.



We have been able to support many children in various ways. We have not only given gifts to children at Christmas but have given clothing, beds, mattresses and bedding, paid for prescriptions, paid for school lunches, given children who needed the experience of a camp the means to attend one and more. This year we are adding another item into our giving. We will be awarding \$500 scholarships to two high school seniors who have been accepted to a college or trade school for the 2016/2017 school year.

The past three years we included the food stand proceeds in our fund but this year we are stepping out of that. We felt that helping one of our own church family is important but because of the rules we have in place for the Rich Huff fund we cannot take anything from that in any way unless the need is for a child. 
Let us know!
