Soup coordinator, Mark Rabuck, along with the rest of the congregation, prep, cook and sometimes even sing to the customers. \$1,068 was raised from the soup sale and donated to Snyder-Union-Northumberland Habitat for Humanity.





UNDERSTANDING OUR SYMBOLS



Do you recognize this symbol?

Do you know where it is in our church?

This is on the altar in our sanctuary. Someone was once overheard asking the following question about

this unusual symbol: “I don’t understand why we talk about the love of money being the root of all evil, but then have a dollar sign on the altar.”

This symbol actually is not a dollar sign. It is actually an unusual styling of the symbol IHS, which is a monogram of the first three letters in Jesus’ name in Roman letters (I = J; H = E; S = S).

Here the three letters are interwoven in a way that unfortunately resembles the dollar sign [\$]. Since the dollar sign did not come into usage until the mid-1700s, and the IHS symbol certainly predates the modern dollar sign by several hundred years, there’s no way the creators of the sign could have known that it might eventually be mistaken for the symbol for money. It is unusual to find this version of the sacred monogram, but if someone asks, you can explain that it actually reminds us that Jesus is present with us at the table of the communion meal.





Did You Know?



At birth, Martin Luther's name was Martin *Luder*. He later changed it to the more academically respectable *Luther*.

Luther almost died at age 19. On his way home from school, a dagger pierced his leg, cutting an artery. Only because he was with a friend, who fetched a doctor, was his life saved.

Luther once said he had not even seen a Bible until he was 20 years old.

As a schoolboy, Martin Luther preferred music to any other subject, and he became proficient at playing the lute. He gave away his lute when he entered the monastic cloister at age 21.

Before he became a friar, Luther was well on his way to becoming a lawyer. He had earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees in the shortest time possible.

By the end of his life, Martin Luther wrote 60,000 pages, yet he hoped that "all my books would disappear and the Holy Scriptures alone be read."

Generally speaking Lutheran teaching can be summed up by "Three Solas": (1) Grace Alone; (2) Faith Alone; (3) Scripture Alone.

Gerald Fairchild Kling

Dec. 24, 2016

Gerald "Jerry" Fairchild Kling, born on December 12, 1941, died suddenly on Saturday morning, December 24, 2016, after his customary walk around the homestead he grew up on and which he loved.

Jerry had been an enthusiastic and inspiring professor of soil science at Oregon State University before he retired and returned to the rural community dubbed "Taylorville" in Lewisburg. There he raised peaches and every summer grew and shared sweet corn with his neighbors and friends. His passions were his friends, his woodworking, and teaching and sharing his skills and knowledge.

He is survived by his wife, Donna Sirinek Kling, whom he married on June 12, 1964, shortly before they left to serve two years in Peace Corps in Peru; his daughter, Lisa Marie Roth and husband, Matthew, and their two children, Anika and Owen; his brother, Herbert Fairchild Kling and wife, Deborah; and his sister, Margaret "Peggy" Fairchild Rahn. Jerry was predeceased by his mother, Ruth Fairchild Kling in 1958, his father, Robert Merrill Kling in 1972, and his stepmother, Elizabeth Eyer Kling in 2004.

Visitation will be held from 10 a.m. to noon on Friday, December 30, 2016 at United in Christ Lutheran Church (Twin Churches), Lewisburg, followed by the funeral at noon. Burial will follow in the church cemetery.


