

FROM THE PASTOR



When the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together, and one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. “Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?” He said to him, “‘You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.’ This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: ‘You shall love your neighbor as yourself.’ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.”

Matthew 22:34-40

Dear, United In Christ,

When I first applied to seminary and entered the candidacy process to become a pastor in the ELCA, I included this episode from Matthew to explain to the candidacy committee and the seminary admissions office why they had my paperwork in front of them. If I was to take Jesus’ two-fold greatest commandment seriously, I could see no better way for myself to love God and love my neighbor than by at least continuing to discern God’s call through the seminary process. Besides, if Jesus told us that the entirety of the scriptural witness (all the law and all the prophets) to that point hung in the balance of this love of God and love of neighbor, then it seemed that this framework made for the perfect rubric through which I could discern what such a calling meant. Five years later, I can honestly say that this passage continues to shape the way I reflect on and continue to listen to God’s call for us in the world.

As we look to the upcoming kickoff of our fall programming and beyond, this two-fold commandment will continue to echo across all we do. In our planning and work, we have the opportunity to continue considering how our actions and activities can best reflect our love for God and our love for neighbor here at UIC. As you look through the activities and events in the weeks ahead (and this newsletter is FULL of them), pay attention to the voice of Jesus speaking to the Pharisees. Where is it that God may be calling you to make example of your love in the days ahead? How can we best make that love of God known to our neighbors around us in the world today?

As we move toward the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, we have the perfect opportunity to consider just how Jesus' command to love God and love our neighbor calls us into that world. Just as Martin Luther, armed with a hammer, a nail, and 95 theses, sought to reform the practices of his church in order to better reflect a love for God and a love for neighbor, so too can we offer our own dreams and vision's in God's Church. In the next few weeks leading up to our Reformation Commemoration, I invite you to reflect on and consider where it is that God may be calling us as a congregation next. What are the ways in which God could be using UIC to best reflect our love for God and our love for those around us? There will be opportunities ahead for you to share these dreams, just as Luther himself did, in order that we might look to the future with the same passion as that monk standing before the doors to Wittenberg Castle Church. Dream big, UIC, and dream in the love on which all else hangs.


HARVEST HOME SUNDAY

STAY IN THE LOOP

We've started using Google Calendar for all of the church's scheduling. In the past, multiple platforms were being used and it wasn't efficient for Terri to update each of them. Now we use one, Google Calendar.

As Terri updates her calendar, you'll be able to see the changes instantly. Go to the church's website, www.unitedinchristlutheran.net and from the homepage scroll down and click on the "Church Calendar" box.



From your internet browser, you can bookmark the church's calendar page. Those of you with smartphones or tablets can add a bookmark icon to your Home Screen for quick access while on the go.

JUST A CLICK AWAY

Click on any event title to view details for that event. On this screen you have the option to view "more details" or "copy to my calendar." If you have a Google calendar, you can add any of the church's events to your own calendar by clicking "copy to my calendar."

Am I a Greeter this Sunday?

To see if you are a Worship Volunteer for a particular Sunday, go to the Sunday in question, click on "Worship" to bring up the details for that event and scroll to the list of volunteers. When the office is notified of any swaps/changes, the lists will be updated.

The calendar is printable and you can change the view from "Month" to "Agenda". Agenda puts all events in a list format, which by the way, is Terri's favor way to view the calendar.



FRESH EXPRESS PROGRAM

The Central Pennsylvania Food Bank has a program called “**Fresh Express**”, which helps everyone in need, regardless of their income. This program not only helps those who are already receiving food assistance, but it’s also designed to help the middle class. There are no income requirements!



The Food Bank receives millions of pounds of fresh produce and dairy products from both local and national donors. Since these products have a short shelf life, the Food Bank takes the perishable products directly to people in need.

Depending on the harvest season, volunteers distribute a variety of perishable items such as potatoes, onions, lettuce, apples, strawberries, and yogurt along with grocery items as well.
