FROM THE PASTOR



Is such the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the head like a bulrush, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes? Will you call this a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord? Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?

Isaiah 58:5-7

Dear, United In Christ,

Do you miss your chocolate yet? Have you had that craving for soda? Have you managed to stay off Facebook so far? We've made it about a third of the way through our Lenten transition from death into life now; how are you doing?

If you're anything like me, I'm sure some days are better than others. Some days it's easier to simply forget about what you've given up. There's enough going on, you keep busy, so you don't even miss it! But then there's the other days, the days when the supermarket candy aisle just *calls* to you. The days when the office party only brought soda to share. The days when you just want to check in on that one Facebook friend you haven't heard from in a while. Those are the tougher days, the small, yet guile, moments that test our mettle. See, this wilderness is clever. These days of wandering

know how to get under our skin. They have this infuriating way of reminding us of those things we don't even have to think about the rest of the year.

Then again, maybe that's exactly why we *need* this season of Lent. Maybe that's why we need this period that transitions us from death to life to see just what it is that we need to die to. This Lenten season has already brought with it stark reminders that we, as a people, have some work to do. It's the work that the author of Isaiah lays before us. Here, in this season of our fasting, we are called to a new fast. It's a fast to "loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke." It calls us to feed those we see hungry, to house those we see without shelter, and to clothe those we see going naked. In short, it's a call to stand up for our neighbors and insist on meeting their needs.

After all, we may feel the struggle of this wilderness journey, but for so many the wilderness is no journey at all: it is their home. As we make this transition from death to life this Lent, may we have the courage to speak such a word of hope and life into the broken spaces of our world. May we loose the bonds of injustice and set the oppressed free. May we break the yokes that bind our neighbors to the structures that hold them back. May we insist on life in the places that spell out death, that others may be greeted by the same Christ who came to greet us and brings each of us through from death to life.

Happy fasting!




