FROM THE PASTOR



The hand of the LORD came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. He said to me, "Mortal, can these bones live?" I answered, "O Lord GOD, you know." Then he said to me,

"Prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. I will lay sinews on you, and will cause flesh to come upon you, and cover you with skin, and put breath in you, and you shall live; and you shall know that I am the LORD."... I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived, and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.

Ezekiel 37:1-6,10

Dear, United In Christ

A few days ago, I finally resigned myself to bringing down the remaining Easter flowers from the sanctuary. After a few weeks of their splendent colors proclaiming the joy of new life in Christ, the wilting stems and falling petals were looking less and less like a sign of the resurrection. While I (foolishly) assumed that their removal would set them on a course that was destined for the back of a garbage truck, a timely intervention reminded me that there was more in store for these little guys. It wasn't long after bringing the flowers downstairs that Carol Troxell came by wondering where they had gone so that they could be planted out along the front of the building. Apparently, more and new life was ahead for these floral friends! It turns out, we weren't done with them yet!

When Ezekiel is set down in the middle of the valley by the hand of God, he sees sprawled out before him a scene that was, quite literally, bone dry in its desolation. All around him lie signs of death and decay. When God turns to him and asks him about these bones' proclivity for life, I imagine the answer was probably pretty obvious for Ezekiel. There's no way that such dry bones could spring back to exude new life! Turns out, though, that much like me looking at the flowers, Ezekiel was dead wrong. Looking out across that same valley, God shares with Ezekiel a vision of new life, even for the dry bones such as these. In turn, the breath of God, the same that fluttered over the birth of creation, fills the bones and reforms them into a standing witness of new life at God's hand.

There's a pretty good reason this text is assigned to the day of Pentecost that we celebrate this month. Last Pentecost, the day you voted to call me as your pastor, I shared a line from a then recent Washington Post article projecting that mainline Protestant churches only had twenty-three Easters remaining in their existence. ¹By my count, this year puts us at twenty-two. Looking around the state of churches around us, we might be tempted to think we're standing in a valley of dry bones. Yet, even as we might worry and fret about the seemingly inevitable decay of our traditions, this Pentecost celebration, the finale to our Easter season, reminds us that we are, and always will be, a resurrection people. The prophet's encounter deep in that valley is a poignant reminder that God is never done breathing new life into God's creation. In short, God's not done with us yet! Let's get these bones moving!


GARDENING GRATITUDE
