

FROM THE PASTOR



Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

Hebrews 1:1-4

Dear United In Christ,

Have you ever noticed how sometimes God likes to approach things a little ~differently~?

I mean, just think about it. For centuries the people of Israel grew accustomed to interacting with God through the routine complex of the Temple in Jerusalem. It's where people came to make their sacrifices and offer up their first fruits to God. They knew that the Temple was the arena in which God operated. In turn, they fully anticipated God's word to arrive through messengers, through prophets to help guide the way. Yet, for all of that setup, for a system so well established, it seemed that things always had a way of going awry. Eventually, we the people made the institution of religion much more about the rules we could enforce, rather than about the God who encounters us.

That's when God decided to try something a little different. Rather than offer up a revision of rules, rather than speak

through one more representative, God decided to come down from on high and step into God's creation. We called him the Son, the Messiah, Emmanuel, the God with us. We called him Jesus. Through him, God finally perfected what God had always set out to do: to establish a good and right relationship with God's people in God's love. And while doing this different thing did not invalidate any of the ways in which God had worked before, it was certainly a new way of acting for our good. It showed that God is still willing to get creative for our sake and try things a little ~differently~.


In this month where we commemorate the bold actions of the Reformers who themselves tried things a little differently, I think it's helpful for us to remember God's precedent for us. God has never let things grow stagnant. At every turn along the way, God has been willing to try new things all for the sake of reaching God's people. It's a heritage that goes further back than even Luther and the Reformers; sometimes we have to try something different, something new. A seminary professor of mine called it "faithful experimentation." It's those moments when we set out to try something, not knowing fully how it will go, but trusting that we do so as faithful stewards of God's mission in the world.

This Reformation month, I encourage you to think boldly! Maybe try something a little ~different~. Embrace the freedom of faithful experimentation and watch where the Holy Spirit takes you. There's no guarantee that every new thing will be met with success, but you can be sure that the God who tried something new to walk alongside you will be there along the way.
