Listen, I will tell you a mystery! We will not all die, but we will all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For this perishable body must put on imperishability, and this mortal body must put on immortality. When this perishable body puts on imperishability, and this mortal body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Corinthians 15:50-57

Dear United In Christ,

Do these words sound familiar? I've read this passage a lot this past year. In fact, I've read more times than I honestly would have liked to. To be fair, some of you have probably heard me read these words more times in the past year than you would have liked to as well. This reading comes to us from 1 Corinthians and is a passage regularly proclaimed at the graveside as we prepare to commit the bodies of the deceased, of our loved ones, to the ground; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust.

We've been to the graveside a fair amount in these past few seasons. We've gathered together to comfort one another as we've remembered fathers, mothers, sisters, brothers, friends, and co-workers in faith. Our community has definitely changed a lot in this last year. Looking around, there are certainly a lot of people to miss and many tears that remain fresh. With all this change, my hope this month is that you can join us for worship this All Saints Sunday on November 4. As we gather together on this day, we will remember and give thanks for the lives and witnesses of the saints from this community who have gone before us into the church triumphant while also celebrating the new lives at work with us in our journeys of faith. It will be a day that holds both grief *and* joy, tears *and* smiles, hurt *and* hope because it is a day that holds both death *and* resurrection.

Which is precisely why I am glad that we are in this *together*. Gathered as a community this month we will remember our baptismal promises that, in the greeting of water and Word, we have been united with Christ in both his own death and resurrection. Together, even in the midst of the sadness we may continue to carry, we will stand in hopeful certainty to proclaim the message that Paul pulls from the prophets for the Corinthian community: death *has* been swallowed up in victory! It may be a difficult reality to see, but it's the one assured for us. As Paul says, our thanks *can* be to God, who gives us this victory through our Lord Jesus Christ!

### HOW CAN YOU HELP?

Several projects and activities include helping out at Magical Memories (a Halloween event for children with life-threatening illnesses from 5 counties), a daddy/daughter dance, Panther Packs, National Night Out, trauma dolls for the fire department, WNEP Trail of Treats (a Halloween event for special needs kids from many school districts), mini libraries in 3 area laundromats, Music in the Park for kids, created activity boxes for children admitted to Evangelical Community Hospital, and provide children's books for our diaper pantry.


