In the first year of King Cyrus of Persia, in order that the word of the Lord by the mouth of Jeremiah might be accomplished, the Lord stirred up the spirit of King Cyrus of Persia so that he sent a herald throughout all his kingdom, and also in a written edict declared: "Thus says King Cyrus of Persia: The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth, and he has charged me to build him a house at Jerusalem in Judah. Any of those among you who are of his people—may their God be with them!—are now permitted to go up to Jerusalem in Judah, and rebuild the house of the Lord, the God of Israel—he is the God who is in Jerusalem; and let all survivors, in whatever place they reside, be assisted by the people of their place with silver and gold, with goods and with animals, besides freewill offerings for the house of God in Jerusalem."

Dear United In Christ.

Have you ever felt like you've just needed a fresh start?

When I was in college and seminary, the end of the semester always felt to me like a cluttered mess of mental disarray. Day to day and hour to hour I felt like I was juggling multiple theses and deadlines all while trying to actually produce content worthy of a decent grade. Inevitably at some point along the way, my drive to do well slipped into a drive to simply survive until the end of the semester when everything would finally come to an abrupt halt. There was hope to be found in the fact that, soon, it would all be over and, in turning over the calendar, I'd be given a clean new slate from which to start.

Even today, I still get hit with that sense of anticipation and hope as we turn the calendar into the new year. I love this annual sensation of feeling like we are being given a fresh start to just about everything we set ourselves to. But for as much as I enjoy the feeling of opening up the new calendar, I can only imagine the sense of astonishment and wonder the Israelites felt at King Cyrus' shocking announcement. After a generation of captivity and exile, the Israelites are told that they are finally going to return home. They are receiving a fresh start, complete with the resources they need to set out on the right foot!

What's shocking, though, is that this news comes from the most unexpected of sources. The Persian King Cyrus, the very ruler who has inherited their captivity, is the one God is stirring to set them free. They aren't being delivered at the hand of a revolutionary, but rather find their liberation in the very one who would otherwise have been their enemy. Their fresh start, you see, is coming from the last place they'd expected.

Maybe that's the point, though. As we wait with hopeful expectation about what this year might hold, we might find that our fresh starts come from the least likely of sources. But from wherever they may come, these fresh starts open to us the possibility of being who God has called us to be. It's a whole new year ahead, so, keep your eyes peeled, UIC. We might just find God's fresh start in the most unexpected of ways.
