

FROM THE PASTOR

But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, but when they went in, they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again." Then they remembered his words, and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.

Dear United In Christ,

There are just some days when no amount of good news ever seems like enough to shake us from our stupor. It's those days when it feels like our misery will never end. It's those days when it feels like the fog will never be lifted. It's those days that make us feel as if there is nothing beyond the gloomy looming haze around us. Chipper, right? Really, though, there are some days when it just feels like things simply won't ever be good again.

It must have been the same way for the apostles whose post-Good Friday daze left them feeling as if their entire world had been turned upside down. After having watched their teacher, mentor, and friend executed in the most degrading and humiliating way conceivable, after watching him suffer a criminal's death on a cross, they are left wondering how they will ever push on. They are in the midst of days filled with sorrow and fear, days that surely drove them to wonder if things could ever get better.

It's little wonder, then, that when the women discover the joyous truth of the empty tomb on that first Easter and report back what they have seen to the apostles, their words fall on deaf ears. The apostles simply aren't having it. Their world is so clouded with gloom that they cannot hear the good news being brought to them. In fact, so impossible does the women's account seem to them that they dismiss the whole thing as an idle tale. To them, the women's story seems fanciful and naïve. Tombs don't simply empty themselves, after all.

Yet, as Peter quickly finds out, this is no idle tale at all. It turns out, the women absolutely had the right of it! Their story was accurate; the linens sitting alone proved what just before seemed unbelievable. The Jesus they had followed all this time had risen! His death had not been the final word. New life was real and it was here! Finally, the truth of the women's good news began to sink in as the dawn of resurrection burst into the gloom of the apostles' world.

And you know, United In Christ, I think that's just what we need. We need the light of a resurrection morning to break into our days. After this Lenten wilderness, you too may find that your days seem long with shadows that would preclude the possibility of any good news. That's why I pray that the light of Easter morning might shine with the good news of new life rushing into this world for you. Whatever it is that seems to be hanging over you, whatever it is that makes it seem like good news is simply impossible, I hope you see it give way to the joy of an empty tomb. This Easter, I hope you come to know intimately well the fact that this joy is no idle tale; this is the Christ who is risen for you. Don't believe me? Well, just come and see.

ONLINE GIVING

We are excited to announce that United In Christ is now officially set up for online giving! This winter, we partnered with an organization called tithe.ly to be able to receive offering for the church through their digital giving platform!

For those Sundays when you forget to write a check, get cash from the bank, or just can't find those envelopes, now you will have the option of giving your offering online. You can even choose to give on Sundays when you know you won't make it to church!

Tithe.ly provides the mechanisms for giving straight from a bank account of your choice *or* through the use of a debit or credit card. If you'd like, you can even set up recurring giving through their platform to make the process of first-fruits giving an automatic one! Still curious? Check out our Q&A section below!

Are we required to start giving online now?

Not at all! If you have a good rhythm with your offering envelopes, then by all means, carry on! No one is required to use the tithe.ly giving option. We simply want to be able to provide as many giving options to make it as easy as possible for givers of all types!

What does tithe.ly cost?

Setting up and hosting UIC's account through tithe.ly is absolutely free for the congregation! To keep the platform running, tithe.ly collects a modest transaction fee (less than 3%), much like a credit card machine at

the convenience store. We even receive a discount on that transaction fee for being an ELCA congregation! During the process, donors do have the option to cover this fee and factor it into their gift so that the congregation receives the full amount of what they intended.

How do I access this online giving?

Easy! You can simply head over to the church's website (www.unitedinchristlutheran.net) and click on the "Giving" tab at the top of the page! From there, you will follow the instructions to the tithe.ly website.

You can also keep your eyes peeled for the QR Code (see below) which will make its way into the bulletin in the near future. Simply scan the code with your phone's QR reader (most new phones have it built into their camera app) and follow the link when prompted! You will be taken directly to the tithe.ly website. It's so quick and easy you could get it done *during* the offering time on a Sunday morning!

Will the church be able to track my giving if I give through tithe.ly instead of my envelope?

Absolutely! When you create the transaction, you will be prompted to input you name. Tithe.ly will then track your giving through their website, which the church has access to so that we can provide you with your annual



giving statements, much the same as when we track with envelope giving.

Use your smartphone, tablet, or iPad and take a photo of the QR Code.

STEWARDSHIP OF TIME

O God, teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart. - Psalm 90:12

What does it mean to count our days? Certainly, the poet who wrote Psalm 90:12 was thinking of more than arithmetic, which may not necessarily gain us a wise heart. Wisdom comes from perspective, from painful introspection and prayerful deliberation.

We count in order to know not only how many days we have *lived*, but to ponder how many days we might have *left*. Counting, we remember that we are finite creatures whose lives march forward in steady 24-hour steps, carrying us from birth to death. Knowing, then, that our days are numbered, we appreciate each one more fully.

We count our days to gain the wisdom that every day is sacred; every day presents opportunities to live more fully in relationship with God and our neighbors; every day is for love and joy and peace and fulfillment. Yet it's all to easy to let the days slip away.

This month consider a focus on stewardship of your time – how you spend every day God gives you. Here is a "to do" list for making the most of every day:

Pray: Begin each day communicating with the creator of the universe, meditating on Scripture or a wise Christian author. Even 10 minutes. End by praying Psalm 118:24: "This is the day that the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."

Care: Convey through word or deed how much you care about someone in your life. Call up an old friend or relative. Invite a co-worker to lunch.

Help: Look for some way to assist someone. Volunteer. Hold a door open for someone entering a store behind you. Stop for a pedestrian who wants to cross the street.

Enrich: Find something that will deepen your knowledge, understanding or appreciation of the world. Read a poem or book. Listen to a sermon podcast or educational news program.

Stop. That's right, do nothing. For at least 10 minutes (use your smart phone timer) sit quietly, breathe deeply and try to clear the busy thoughts form your mind. Open your spirit to God's presence.

Be healthy: Do something to increase your physical health, such as eating a nutritious meal or taking a walk.

Pray: End every day thanking the creator of the universe for another wonderful day. A day you have counted and that you have made count.

Focus on stewardship of time and see how your own life will change. Make it a permanent part of your discipleship.


