# FROM THE PASTOR

The word that Isaiah son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

In days to come the mountain of the LORD'S house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hills; all the nations shall stream to it. Many peoples shall come and say, "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths." For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the LORD!

Isaiah 2:1-5

#### Dear United In Christ,

Is there a time of year more heavy-laden with both spoken and unspoken expectations than the month of December?

With every wrapped mystery under the tree, with every holiday calendar being lined up, with every personality being matched to a corresponding expression of love and gratitude, there is a weight of expectation hanging in the air. In this time of year there is always that extra sense of pressure to not let anyone down. We don't want to disappoint. We want everything to go just perfectly right at every step along the way. We set such high expectations for ourselves and for this season that it's a wonder that it doesn't burn us all out before it even arrives!

Then again, this level of expectation and anticipation really isn't

anything new. In the prophet Isaiah's words, we hear of similarly lofty expectations. Here the prophet envisions a future where God's reign from on high will draw all peoples together while issuing truly just arbitration. At the same time, he imagines God ushering in an age where swords can at last be beaten into plowshares and spears into pruning hooks as nations cease rising against one another. It's a radically beautiful image of what the fullness of God's arrival will look like and it's one that's *steeped* in heavy expectations for that arrival.

As we head into the season of Advent, we may just find that our expectations are not all that different from the prophet's. As we await the arrival of a Messiah, we do so with great expectations about what that day will look like. We long for the day when God's peace and justice will be made manifest for the sake of this world that God so loves. This Advent, as with every Advent that has come before, we will gather in hope-filled anticipation for the arrival of one who will carve for us a new way out of our brokenness to offer a word of life for all God's people across all time.

And so we look to the baby. As we await God's arrival with great expectations, we look to the one who has made such perfect and just ways known in the vulnerability of taking on flesh and entering into this world. As we await the fullness of God's reign, as we await the birth of a Savior in this season, may you continue to find the fulfillment of your expectations in the God who comes wielding peace and justice from broken swords and spears. In this season, may you gather in wonder at the newborn king who shows — and lives — a new way forward for you and for all creation. Come and see this thing that has taken place. O come let us adore him!

## SANDY HOOK VIGIL



As we move into this season of Advent, a time of holy anticipation, we do so with a remembrance that our world still longs for a peace made perfect in our midst. The start of December also marks a day that many will nev-

er forget as one where their time of waiting was met with cold indifference as they learned of the deaths of their children and loved ones in the shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School on December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2012. Every year during this month across the country, hundreds of vigils are held to remember those who still long for the ones they've lost.

This year, United In Christ has the privilege of hosting one of these vigils. On **Tuesday, December 3**<sup>rd</sup> **at 6:30 pm** we will gather here in a time of reflection and interfaith conviction to remember those who were lost to the abject brokenness of the world seven years ago. We hope you will join us for this difficult, yet sacred time, as we remember the twenty-six victims who died in the Sandy Hook shooting and support one another in the midst of the grief that remains from that time. All are welcome to attend this vigil service.

## STEWARDSHIP FOR ADVENT AND CHRISTMAS

Many of us cherish everything about the Christmas season -- except those incessant advertisements telling us to buy this and buy that. We ask, "Where's Jesus in all this commercialism?"

This is the right question. Though it asks us to examine every aspect of our lives, stewardship particularly challenges us to question the role money plays in our personal lives and our culture.

Christmas presents are wonderful expressions of love that makes both giver and recipient feel good. At the same time, we want to be wary of advertising's lure to make us overspend, or to think that the cost of our gift is proportionate to our love.

Most of all, we need to be sure that the main point of our Christmas is not the gifts we give, but the gift we receive from God – Jesus. Here are some ideas:

Challenge yourself to spend less for presents this year. Set a budget and stick to it.

Attend worship regularly in Advent and Christmas.

Give some handmade presents: A scarf or hat, a photo album, a batch of fudge, a card, a poem.

Prayerfully read Advent daily devotions (Richard Rohr's *Preparing for Christmas* is amazing!).

Give your time: a concert together, a shared meal, a day at a museum, a walk in the woods

Use an Advent calendar to help you remember all that God has given you.

Give service: wash a loved one's car, help clean the garage, paint a room, babysit for an evening.

Play Christmas music that has religious themes (More "Silent Night," less "Frosty the Snowman.")

Instead of buying a present, make a donation to a charitable organization in honor of your loved one (or check out ELCA Good Gifts!).

Make a generous year-end contribution to your congregation.

Our thoughtful practices for Advent and Christmas not only make for good stewardship of our time, talents, relationships and money, they also help us to draw near to Our Lord and experience God's greatest gift to us.
