FROM THE PASTOR



Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

1 Corinthians 13:4-13

Dear United In Christ,

Alright, raise your hand if you heard this text at the last wedding you attended.

I bet there are a *lot* of hands up right now. In reading these words, some of you may have even been reflecting on this piece of scripture's place of prominence in your own wedding ceremony! It's a beautiful text that deserves a place of prominence, but I wonder if we really take in *all* of what's said here.

As Paul writes to the Corinthians about his myriad of childish ways, he's really reflecting on the scope of a love that he's only ever caught glimpses of. Throughout these verses (that really are probably most often quoted during wedding ceremonies), Paul exhorts the role of love and the foundation that it can provide, especially to communities brewing with potential conflict. That, after all, is the situation of the Corinthian community. They are a community rife with disagreements and power plays trying to secure their own positions with one another. In many ways, they've fallen victim to

their own agendas, thinking that it's more important for them to be right than it is for them to be a community that is whole. It turns out, they need a dose of love.

But here's the thing, this is no childish love. As a kid, I used to think that love was what you called it when you "like-liked" someone. It's what spurred you to risk passing notes of infatuation in class (or slyly sending off a text) when the teacher wasn't looking. Love was the designation you gave when you liked someone else enough that you wanted to spend more time with *them* than with anyone else. It's why I think that this text shows up in all those wedding ceremonies! Turns out, though, that this is only seemingly dimly as through a mirror.

The love that Paul is exhorting – the type of love that has the power to shape and form a whole community – now that's different stuff. That's the type of unconditioned love that's willing to set aside personal interest to prioritize the "other" in our midst. It's the unconditional love that's willing to sacrifice self-advancement in order to ensure that the lowly are taken care of. It's the unconditional love that endures all things because it requires the full investment of each participant in the well-being of everyone else at the table. It's the type of love that's not just about "like-liking" the person you choose to spend more time with, but it's the love that's about being known fully for who you are.

And honestly, it's a love that's only ever been perfected in the one who has *known you*. While all else has been dim reflections of this perfected love, in the risen Christ, you have been met by the fullyformed love of God and claimed *without condition* in God's life. We might not even fully know it yet, but we can rest in the promises that we have already been fully known in that love. And *that's* a love worthy of being the foundation to build upon. Let's get building!

UPDATED COVID-19 RESPONSE



On Tuesday, July 20th, the Congregational Council of United In Christ gathered for its monthly meeting during which it adopted a new set of guidelines and procedures for the building in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Most of those changes have to deal with adjustments being made to worship as we resume many of our tradi-

tional practices and adopt new ones together over the next few weeks. The most pertinent update to our policy is in regards to masking at the building.

At this time, individuals who have not yet been vaccinated are expected to wear their masks inside the building as we continue to seek to care for one another and be good stewards of each other's health. Nevertheless, we will still invite all individuals gathered for worship to don masks during congregational singing to help reduce any potential overall spread.

As always, our procedures and guidelines remain subject to change. Given the continued dynamic nature of the pandemic, our policies may yet need to be updated in the future should our local situations change.

A PASTORAL PLEA

If you have not yet received your COID-19 vaccine, please do so at your first available opportunity. In the face of more contagious strains of the virus and recognizing that unvaccinated individuals are now carrying the *vast* weight of the pandemic's toll, I would ask that if you are able and eligible to receive the vaccine, you do so as soon as possible. Having seen the horrors the virus can wreak upon individuals and families, I would implore you to

seek out vaccination not only for your own health and safety, but for that of those around you as well. As we gather as a community once again, we do so with those in our midst who are still *ineligible* to receive the vaccines, namely our youngest students. The best resource we have at our disposal to keep those who *cannot* get vaccinated safe is to get vaccinated ourselves and reduce the overall risk posed for them in our gathering.



At the same time, if you have friends or family who have not yet received the vaccine, I would ask that you please encourage them to also schedule an appointment as soon as possible. To this point, the Congregational Council has been basing a lot of its decisions off of local data, including positivity rates and vaccination rates. The greater our local communities become vaccinated, the more confident we can be in our approaches and procedures ahead!

As always, if you have any questions or concerns about the vaccines, please do not hesitate to reach out. As I wrote in our last newsletter, I genuinely believe that getting vaccinated is our most faithful response as Christians in the wake of the pandemic. Getting your vaccine is the greatest gift at our disposal right now to heed Jesus' call to love our neighbor and fulfill what he calls the greatest of commandments!

Glen Thompson Van Dyke March 18, 1945 - July 6, 2021



Glen Thompson Van Dyke, 76, of Mifflinburg, entered into rest at 3:25 a.m. Tuesday, July 6, 2021, at Evangelical Community Hospital, Lewisburg.

He was born March 18, 1945, in Philadelphia, a son of the late Paul C. and June T. (Thompson) Van Dyke. Glen and Florence are members of Chalfont UMC, Chalfont. It was here he met and married his loving wife, Florence. They celebrated their 26th anniversary

on June 24, 2021.

Glen was a graduate of Radnor High School in Radnor. He obtained his bachelor's degree from Eastern University, in St. Davids, and completed one-year additional studies at Cheyney State University in Cheyney.

Glen started out as a church organist/choir director at numerous churches in the Philadelphia area. He was then employed at the Souderton Mennonite Homes where he retired in 2007 as a maintenance supervisor. After retirement, he devoted more time to his passion of serving as church music director around the Mifflinburg area. Since moving to Mifflinburg in 2007, he has served at Christ United Lutheran Church, Millmont, United In Christ Lutheran Church in Lewisburg, Trinity Lutheran Church in Hughesville, and Dreisbach United Church of Christ, Lewisburg. In addition to church work, he sang and was an accompanist in the Philadelphia Boys Choir and Men's Chorale.

Over the years in the area, he enjoyed being an active member of the Kiwanis Club of Mifflinburg, singing in the Susquehanna Valley Chorale, delivering Meals on Wheels and being a former member of the American Guild of Organists and the Central PA Chamber of Commerce. He also enjoyed woodworking. He is survived by two sons, Kevin W. (Margaret) Van Dyke, and Mark G. (Kimberly) Van Dyke; two grandsons; two step-grandchildren; three brothers and their spouses, twin brother, Dr. Don C. (Hongjun) Van Dyke of Iowa City, Iowa, and Dr. Gary P. (Maurine) Van Dyke of Churchtown, and Jan P. (April) VanDyke of Bloomington, Ind.; one niece, his godchild; three nephews; and numerous cousins.

Family and friends had a time of visitation from 10 to 11 a.m. Thursday, July 15, at the First Evangelical Lutheran Church, 404 Market St., Mifflinburg, where a memorial service followed at 11, with Rev. 
