FROM THE PASTOR



Furthermore, it is taught that we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin and righteousness before God through our merit, work, or satisfactions, but that we receive forgiveness of sin and become righteous before God out of grace for Christ's sake through faith when we believe that Christ has suffered for us and that for his sake our sin is forgiven and righteousness and eternal life are given to us. For God will regard and reckon this faith as righteousness in his sight, as St. Paul says in Romans 3 and 4.

Article IV. Concerning Justification, Augsburg Confession (German Text)

Dear United In Christ,

It's about that time of year again! It's time for us to break out the red paraments and the red vestments and the red shirts and the red shoes for worship! Heck, I bet we'd even roll out a red carpet if we had one! This month we once again celebrate Reformation Sunday, a tradition so near and dear to our Lutheran hearts, and all we can see is red! So, what's the deal in

the first place? Why all of this hullabaloo? Why do we make such a big deal out of this one day? Was the message of the Reformation really so noteworthy that we should continue to mark its anniversary



some 500 years later? I mean, was one rambunctious monk with an overzealous hammer and a few hot takes about indulgences and his church really worth all of this pomp and circumstance?

Well, look for yourself! Read what it is that Martin Luther and the Reformers¹ say is at stake. Here, in the fourth article of the Augsburg Confession, the document found at the heart of the Reformation movement, we find the crux of the matter. After laying out their confessional understandings of God, sin, and Jesus Christ in the first three articles, here they lend this place of prominence to the turning point of the Reformation: "we cannot obtain forgiveness of sin and righteousness before God through our merit, work, or satisfactions," but instead it is by God's grace through faith that we receive the forgiveness and stand in righteousness! In a church that was constantly putting qualifiers and requirements on the positions of forgiveness for God's people, the Reformers clearly stake their claim! Here, this article on justification gets to the heart of the matter: the gifts of forgiveness and righteousness are nothing we work for ourselves! They are the very gifts of God given through faith in the person of Christ Jesus!

God's gifts freely given, not earned!

Now this is good news! This is cause for celebration! The heart of the Reformation, grounded in the very heart of Scripture, is the conviction of God's gifts freely given, not earned! It was a reclaimed message that changed everything for the church of the Reformers' age and it's a message that continues to be revolutionary. In a world that tries to tell us that we are worth

only the sum of what we can earn or make or produce, the message that God lavishes God's gifts of forgiveness and righteousness without merit is one of liberation! It frees us from the perpetual cycle of worrying if we'll ever truly measure up to God's worthiness!

And now, 500 years later, it's the message of good news that we can share with our own community! Now, we get to keep the process of reformation going! Now we heed the call to share this word of freedom with the world and live into it's possibilities! Having been reformed, may we now get back out there to keep reforming the world around us until all come to know the joy found in the freedom and gifts of God!

Happy Reformation!



CML FALL FRISBEE FUNDAY





UPDATED MASKING POLICY AT UIC



At its last monthly meeting, the United In Christ Congregational Council voted to adopt masking guidelines based on CDC guidance that counties experiencing substantial or high transmission of COVID-19 return to universal mask wearing while indoors.
