FROM THE PASTOR



Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

Dear United In Christ,

I know this may come as a bit of a shock to you, but I don't wait well. I've never been good at it. Now don't get me wrong; I can exude a dose of patience when it's required, but simply waiting — being put into some sort of holding pattern — I'm just not good at it. I get antsy. My energy gets all pent up. I look for something to do in the middle of the waiting.

Which is why the story of Simeon is one that has always astounded me. Here is this guy who actually managed to wait for what God had promised and he saw the promise fulfilled! I'm not certain just how long Simeon's waiting lasted, but if the promise was that he would not see death before the arrival of God's Messiah, then the implication certainly seems to be that he waited more than his fair share of years. He must have been well into an elderly age before the promise came true as the baby Jesus was brought to the Temple for dedication. I look at Simeon and, if I'm honest with myself, I think "there's just no way." I would have gone mad!

Maybe you've often felt the same way. Maybe you've felt like the

waiting in life has been nothing less than torture. As we head into this Advent season together, this season of preparation and waiting I'm reminded that I'm not the only one who can't seem to wait well. As the stores and marketplaces and restaurants and TV stations around us all rush headlong into Christmas advertising and programming, it seems that *none* of us want to endure this Advent waiting. Nobody wants to sit in patience; we want to reach our celebration and reach it *now*.

Maybe, then, we ought to think about our waiting this year a little differently. Maybe there's room for us to engage in some *active* waiting in this season together. As we prepare for the arrival of God's promised presence in our midst this Christmas, maybe we can wait and with an anticipation *that keeps watch for glimpses of that presence already here*. Maybe we can prepare ourselves in such a way that we are ready to see God's realm breaking into this world right here and right now.

To that end, I invite you to participate with us in our "Keep Watch" Advent worship series this year. As we gather for worship each Sunday, I invite you to bring with you pictures or objects or trinkets that represent where you see God at work right now in the world. Each week we will take time to focus on the respective themes of each of the candles on the Advent wreath: hope, peace, joy, and love. As we gather for worship, then, we have opportunity to share with one another just where we are seeing that hope, peace, joy and love on display and, in so doing, sustain one another amid the waiting. Check out the section later in a bulletin for a breakdown on how to participate each week!

In the meantime, keep up the holy work, United In Christ. In this time where we wait for so much already (for an end to a deadly pandemic, the return to a sense of normalcy, for a better tomorrow), may we sustain one another in the waiting. May we take this Advent season to heart and prepare ourselves to see God's promised arrival around us. Keep waiting!

Please consider joining us as we are surrounded with warmth and welcome in a time to seek hope and healing. All are welcome.


Christmas Eve Services

Irene Stark, 86, formerly of Lewisburg, passed away peacefully, Thursday, Oct. 28, 2021, at the Milton Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

She was born in Sunbury on March 9, 1935, the daughter of the late Marlin and Gertie (Wolfe) Renn. She married the late Gerald R. Stark on Sept. 1, 1962. He was the love of her life.

She was the mother to six children.

In addition to her parents and husband, she was preceded in death by an infant son, Lee Marlin, and her stepmother, Myrtle Renn.

She is survived by daughters, Victoria Kerstetter (Ronald) of Lewisburg, Dawn Bressler (Robert) of Loganton, Alecia Stark Engle of Elysburg, and Pristeen "Teena" Zimmerman (Robert) of Pennsdale; and son, Gerald A. (Lisa) of Lisbon Falls, Maine. She is also survived by her brother, Darvin Renn (Ruth) of Selinsgrove; stepsister, Celestia Campbell (Myron) of Penns Creek; and stepbrothers, Cloyd Campbell (Sue) of Sunbury and Floyd Campbell of Sunbury. The joys of her life were her nine grandchildren, 12 great-grandchildren, and many nieces and nephews.

She was called by God to be an R.N. and take care of people and she did so for many years working at Geisinger, Evangelical Community Hospital, the former Golden Star Nursing Home, the Former Kramm Nursing Home, A.C.F., Biometric Profiles,

and RiverWoods Nursing Home where she retired at the age of 75.

She attended United In Christ Lutheran Church, was a member of Lewisburg Order of the Easter Star Chapter No. 394, and served on the Advisory Board of the Lewisburg Rainbow Assembly No. 158 and was awarded the Grand Cross of Color. She enjoyed attending OAKS Senior Center to play bingo, watching football, bull riding and the Hallmark Channel on television, and talking with family and friends on the telephone.
