Thus says the LORD, who makes a way in the sea, a path in the mighty waters, who brings out chariot and horse, army and warrior; they lie down, they cannot rise, they are extinguished, quenched like a wick: Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. The wild animals will honor me, the jackals and the ostriches; for I give water in the wilderness, rivers in the desert, to give drink to my chosen people, the people whom I formed for myself so that they might declare my praise. Isaiah 43:14-21

Dear United In Christ,

So, what's new with you?

I don't know about you, but feels like I get asked this question all the time. Maybe it's been a plethora of opportunities as we've seen more people around the holidays, but I feel as if this question is so often on everybody's lips. It seems to be the conventional way of checking in with one another around this time of year, but I've got to confess that sometimes it doesn't feel like I have a good answer! I've found lately that my response more often than not has been: "oh, everything and nothing all the same time." Because some days it really does feel as if everything keeps on moving ahead, but nothing ever really changes.

Maybe you've felt this too. Maybe now with the hustle and bustle of the Christmas season in hindsight, maybe you're looking around thinking that a lot really has stayed the same. And now as we enter into this new year together, maybe it feels like all that "same-ness" is actually here to stay. As we turn our calendars over to 2022, maybe you feel like we're just putting the world on repeat. Maybe, after nearly two years now, it feels like we're simply dealing with a case of "same pandemic, different day."

In a lot of ways, this seemingly perpetual same-ness offers us even just a small glimpse of what it was that the Israelites were experiencing as these words from Isaiah met them. Having been carted away into exile with little to no hope of return, they must have known what it felt like to have their world shaken around them while simultaneously feeling like nothing would ever change. And yet, into their situation – into their same-ness – God moves to offer a new thing. To these chosen people, God offers the hope of accompaniment, the very same that was enough to bring them out of Egypt in the first place! Here, the people can cling to this word that the world will change and God will bring them through to a new life ahead.


Eventually, the people were brought out of exile and returned home – albeit after more years of being strangers in a strange land than many of them bargained for. The new thing that God declared for the people, this new way forward through the wilderness, it took root to provide a life that people struggle to imagine in the middle of their same-ness. And now, in this new year, that same word of hope come on that same word worth clinging to, *this new thing* is just as assuredly taking root. Still living in the wake of God's arrival in the Christ child, we are reminded that God sets a new course wherein nothing will ever be the same! Here and now God's promises come to greet God's people – come to greet *you* – and provide for them in new and unexpected ways!

So, hold on, United In Christ, in this new year. May you find this new thing taking shape around you, even amid the sameness, to bring you to that which God has in store!

Willard N. Hauck, 75, of Lewsburg, passed away Monday, Nov. 22, 2021, at Geisinger Medical Center.

A native of Union County, he was born in Lewisburg on Jan. 25, 1946, a son of the late Charles

and Pauline (Minium) Hauck. He was married to the former Pamella Marquardt and his death breaks a marital union of 50 years.

He was a graduate of Lewisburg High School with the class of 1963. He was a farmer, maintenance worker at RiverWoods, a truck driver for LRJ, and a school bus driver providing service to three generations of local families. He was a life-long member of the United Church of Christ West Milton, where he had served as council member; was a member of Lewisburg Young Farmers where he had served as treasurer for many years; enjoyed camping, reading and word search puzzles.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two

daughters, Julie Hauck of Lewisburg, and Rebecca Hauck of New Zealand; a son, Timothy Hauck (Jennifer) of New Columbia; three granddaughters, Maiya Hauck-Dabney, Ava Hauck-Dabney and Olivia Hauck; three brothers, Dale (Nancy) Hauck, Roy (Cheryl) Hauck and Glenn (Pat) Hauck; two sisters, Shirley Anderson and Linda (William) Harris, and numerous nephews and nieces.


