FROM THE PASTOR



"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another. ~ John 15:12-17

Dear United In Christ,

February was always a stressful month in elementary school. As the school's bulletin boards began to fill up with hues of reds and pinks, as the hearts started appearing on every surface, I could always fill the apprehension rising. Seasonal candy would start lining the aisles of the grocery store and I would feel the pit growing in my stomach. As we decorated our shoeboxes to turn them into personalized mailboxes, the reality could no longer be avoided: Valentine's Day was here.

Now I don't know if my anxiety around Valentine's Day was a ubiquitous one for my generation or not, but the fact of the matter was that I absolutely agonized over which Valentines to give to whom in school. Taking my pool of pre-made paper cards (typically either Star Wars or Pokémon themed, if I got to pick), I would painstakingly choose which person should receive which little message. How many cool Chewbacca cards did I have at my disposal? Would it be too much to address the Pikachu one saying "I choose you" to the girl I had a crush on? Would the person at the desk next to me be

offended if I gave them the lame C3-PO card? Each Valentine's day felt like a master lass in social navigation wherein I was disclosing a part of myself in the cards being delivered. The last thing I wanted was to send the wrong message to someone and land squarely within a humiliating faux-pas! I had to make sure that I sent the right message!

"No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friend," Jesus says. Whoah! I don't even know who I would send that Valentine to, but something tells me you won't be finding such sentiment on any little piece of paper card. But here Jesus is, laying it all out there for those who are gathered around him. His sentiment of this love, his implication that it is found in the very laying down of one's life for one another, it's one of deeply seated conviction. This call to love is one that takes the whole of life and sees it as being intrinsically connected with the lives of those around us. To lay down one's life for one another requires a recognition that our own life is entirely grounded in the neighbors in our midst.

Now that's a love that not even Hallmark could capture! Yet, in this month of expressions of sentimentality, the reminder is that the love to which Jesus calls us is a far greater thing. The love that makes disciples – the love with which he first greets us – is enough to change the entire scenario. Here, we are called to step out in a love that seeks the well-being of those around us as if it were our own well-being. Here, having been met by the self-giving love of God, we reach out to this world with our own selves. Here, we find ourselves caught up on God's mission of building up a kingdom governed by a command of love.


