Dear United In Christ,

There are very few moments in my childhood that have been filled with more wonder and curious possibility than the annual rush of catching that first glimpse of what waited beneath the tree every Christmas morning. Whether it was coming downstairs at 6:00am after my brother's annual Christmas morning wake-up call or arriving at our grandparents' house and heading straight to the room annexed for gift corralling, seeing the sea of mystery sitting beneath the tree was always a sight to behold. That first glimpse was always filled with such intense wonder, our little minds reeling with the seemingly infinite possibility of what treasures all that tinsel and ribbon held together. It's always been a real Schrödinger's Christmas situation as we tried to figure out what it all might just contain; to say that we were hopeful in the days leading up would be an absolute understatement.

So, how high is your hope right now? We've turned the corner now! With Thanksgiving in the rearview mirror, with our sanctuary decorated in its anticipatory Advent blue, with the radio stations turning over to their seasonal holiday marathon, how high is your hope and anticipation this season? Do you find yourself putting a lot of stock in wondering what could be this Christmas? Do you get caught in the anticipation hoping that the season might carry with it all that you can imagine?

Admittedly, a lot of our hopes and anticipation may have changed over the years. Maybe you aren't wondering about what will be under the tree, but rather who will be around it. Maybe your anticipation isn't hung up on the trimmings on the table, but rather on the test results you're waiting to hear. Maybe you aren't concerned about what kind of gift you'll manage to score, but what kind of world is around the corner in a time when all seems to be on edge. Maybe you're coming into this Christmas with a hope against hope that seems qualitatively different from the anticipation of years gone by.

It turns out, the ancestors of our faith knew a thing or two about such hope and anticipation. Living as a people in diaspora, having lost their royal lineage, existing as strangers in a strange land, the people of Israel found themselves with little to cling to other than a shred of hope. They dreamed of the one who would restore their people and their identity. You can hear the heights of their hope in the titles they ascribe to the one for whom they wait: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. These are lofty expectations. They are weighty hopes of a people not always knowing where they will go next, but knowing whom to turn to. Just the same, with whatever uncertainty and anticipation you may find yourself carrying, this is the same hope worth clinging to. As we wait in anticipation, we do so trusting – hoping – that the same one worthy of such lofty ascription is once more breaking into our midst. This is, after all, the very celebration we make space for in this coming Christmas season. Whatever uncertainty we may carry, we gather trusting that God is still entering into this world, entering into our lives, entering into our gatherings to bear God's redeeming love for this weary world.



'IT'S THE THOUGHT THAT COUNTS'

Jesus said, "Give, and it will be given to you." -Luke 6:38

Why is it so hard to find that all-too-elusive "perfect gift" for the loved ones in your life? For many of us, it's because they already have everything they need and most of what they want.

It sometimes feels impossible to find a gift that won't be banished to that closet for unwanted, unneeded, and unused presents -- alongside the loud ties, the strong perfumes, the unread books, and the garish sweaters.

When it comes to gift-giving, it's often said, "It's the thought that counts." If that's true, why do we still put so much emphasis on the gift?

This year focus on the thoughts behind your Christmas gifts. Thoughts in keeping with the season. Thoughts of meeting real needs and giving where it will be much appreciated. With so many disadvantaged people in the world, at least some of our Christmas budget would be well spent helping our needy neighbors.

If you are buying for a loved one who has everything, consider instead giving a monetary donation in their honor to a worthy charity that helps the poor. Some charities, such as Heifer International and ELCA Good Gifts, let you buy a specific item – such as a goat or pig for a family, or a water well for a village – to help people in the developing world.

Make the gift in your loved one's name or honor, and then describe it in a card attached to a low-cost "token" gift, such as a small box of chocolates or a bottle of wine. The better part of your gift will go to someone who truly needs it, and your loved one will share the joy of loving and helping your neighbors in need.

Just remember, 'It's the thought that counts!"

Christmas Eve Services



* 11:00pm Candlelight Service music will begin at 10:45pm




