When they had come to the land of Canaan, Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh. At that time the Canaanites were in the land. Then the LORD appeared to Abram, and said, "To your offspring I will give this land." So he built there an altar to the LORD, who had appeared to him.

Dear United In Christ,

There was always a sort of bittersweet atmosphere surrounding the end of every school year. On the one hand, it was always a great sense of relief that came with the knowledge that the weeks ahead would finally be opened up without the strain of extra obligation; the promised freedom that came with the summer months was a welcomed respite after the hustle and bustle of the year. On the other hand, it was always difficult to give up the sense of routine and normalcy that the school year held. Having to wrap things up with favorite teachers and professors, having to say goodbye to classmates and roommates, they made the departure of the year a difficult one. The turning pages of the end of each school year were no easy task!

Even now, this transition into the start of summer may just bring with it **all the feels**. Many of our families will re-discover the catalyst of summer as our students spend this in-between time preparing to move from one grade to the next. Many of us will be preparing for the weighty transitions of students moving away to college in the weeks ahead while others will be asking themselves what post-graduation life will have in store. Many may even take the newfound pace of the summer to do their own professional discernment – to see if there may be additional transitions waiting on the horizon.

During a season that is fraught with inherent transition and change, it may be tempting to look backwards for the better days. It's easy to find the summertime awash with a nostalgia for the days gone by. This may be a time when we look back with longing for a time we once knew, a simpler time, a time we wish we could recover. We look at the transitions marked on the calendar and wish that time could instead roll the days backwards instead of pushing ardently ahead to that which we know is coming. We cling to the patterns and familiarity we know in the face of unyielding change ahead.

Part of me wonders if this was how Abram first handled the delivery of God's promises to him. As he hears God's instruction to go out from the land he knew into the land God has promised with God's blessing, does Abram cling to that which he has held dear for so long? Is there a moment where he wants nothing more than to stay in *his* country with *his* kindred in the safe familiarity of *his* father's house? Even with the very promises of God leading him onward into a future filled with a numerous generation, is Abram able to enter whole-heartedly or does he long for the simpler days now behind him?

Yet, regardless of his orientation toward the course ahead, Abram *is* called by God into this new venture and he is blessed

for the journey. "I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing," God declares. As God calls Abram into this new venture, leading him into paths as yet unseen, God's promise is one of steadfast presence. As Abram journeys, he will *not* be left to his own. There may be no going back, but the God who accompanied Abram's kin is the same God who will be with him throughout the journey ahead, offering nothing less than continued blessing in that future.

And see, United In Christ, this is the same promise that God continues to offer generations upon generations later. We who are the future into which Abram faithfully stepped are still accompanied by this same God of blessing. Whatever transitions may lie ahead – personally, professionally, congregationally – whatever familiarity we are reluctant to release, whatever unknown future waits for us, we journey knowing that we are not abandoned. We journey knowing that God accompanies God's beloved wherever their next steps may take them. We journey in confidence, trusting in the God who goes with us in whatever lies ahead.





# DON'T LET YOUR OFFERINGS

Ahhh, summer! A time to relax and grab much-needed R & R. Vacations and weekend getaways may keep you away from church, but our congregation is still bustling with activity. The bills never take a summer holiday.

It's enormously helpful to the congregation's balance sheet if your gifts, tithes and offerings continue to come in regularly, even if you are away. Here are some ideas for staying current:

**Pay in advance:** Plan ahead by offering more in the weeks in advance of your time away from church.

Make it up: When you return, give a little more in the weeks that follow.

**Use your envelopes:** Here's a tip that's good not only for summer, but year-round: If you use giving envelopes and checks, simply prepare them weeks in advance and bring them to church when convenient.

**Use banking bill pay:** Most online banking services will write and send checks for you. Just plug in the church address, the amount of the gift and how often you want it sent. Viola! You're done!

**Enroll in electronic giving:** Use the congregation's online giving portal to regularize your gift, tithe or offering.

**Give monthly or quarterly:** Sometimes it's hard to anticipate how many Sundays you'll be away from church. Planning your gift, tithe or offering for monthly or quarterly can keep you current.

Of course, these methods are beneficial not only for the summer months, but also for the whole year through. Those who embrace giving as a spiritual discipline often find that their lives

of faith are enriched and their sense of joy and fulfillment is deepened. Choosing a regular-giving strategy can help you to discover the joys of generosity.




