# FROM THE PASTOR



*When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, “Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?” When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, “Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.” So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.*

Mark 16:1-8

Dear United In Christ,

Did you know that the oldest manuscripts we have of Mark’s Gospel end right there? That’s it. Verse eight is all that those manuscripts have to offer as parting words. After sixteen chapters of material that move at a nearly breakneck pace in rapid development (Mark’s favorite Greek word of urgency is “immediately,” after all), the entire story full of healings and exorcisms and miraculous feedings – the entire good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God – it simply ends *here*. In the wake of an empty tomb, the tone wraps up with terror and amazement – it ends with sealed mouths revealing nothing more out of the fear that has stopped them up.



And, see, *that* is the genius of Mark's story telling. If, indeed, these oldest manuscripts represent the closest form to original we have of Mark's writing, then step aside Kubrick and Spielberg, because this is some masterful storytelling at work here. Because what Mark does in the wake of the empty tomb is he makes the reader – he makes you and I – the ones who have to carry the story on! What his Gospel makes clear is that the witness to this Christ no longer relies upon the players and the actors Mark introduced us to. The responsibility of the good news no longer rests with only the disciples who first followed Jesus. Their part of the story is over and they are saying nothing to anyone! Instead, you and I are implicated in carrying this good news away from the tomb! Mark passes us the baton and tells us to finish the race – to tell the rest of this story!

As we move towards our Easter celebration at the end of this month, maybe *this* is the Easter reminder we actually need! Maybe this Easter is *our* chance to keep telling the story. Even through terror and amazement, we now become messengers of this good news: the tomb is open! Alleluia! Christ is risen! Now is our chance to be a part of this same story yet unfolding for the world! Here and now, in *this* Easter, we have the opportunity to tell others about our encounters with this risen Christ.

So what's the rest of the story, UIC? Where have you seen signs of God's risen life breaking into your world? Where has the Spirit moved you to encounter newfound neighbors with the hope and joy of the empty tomb? Where has Jesus shown himself to be alive and well in your lives and the lives of those around you? This is your chance to pick up the pen and keep the story going because Alleluia! Christ *is* risen!

He is risen, indeed! Alleluia!

## Parables of Jesus Study Series

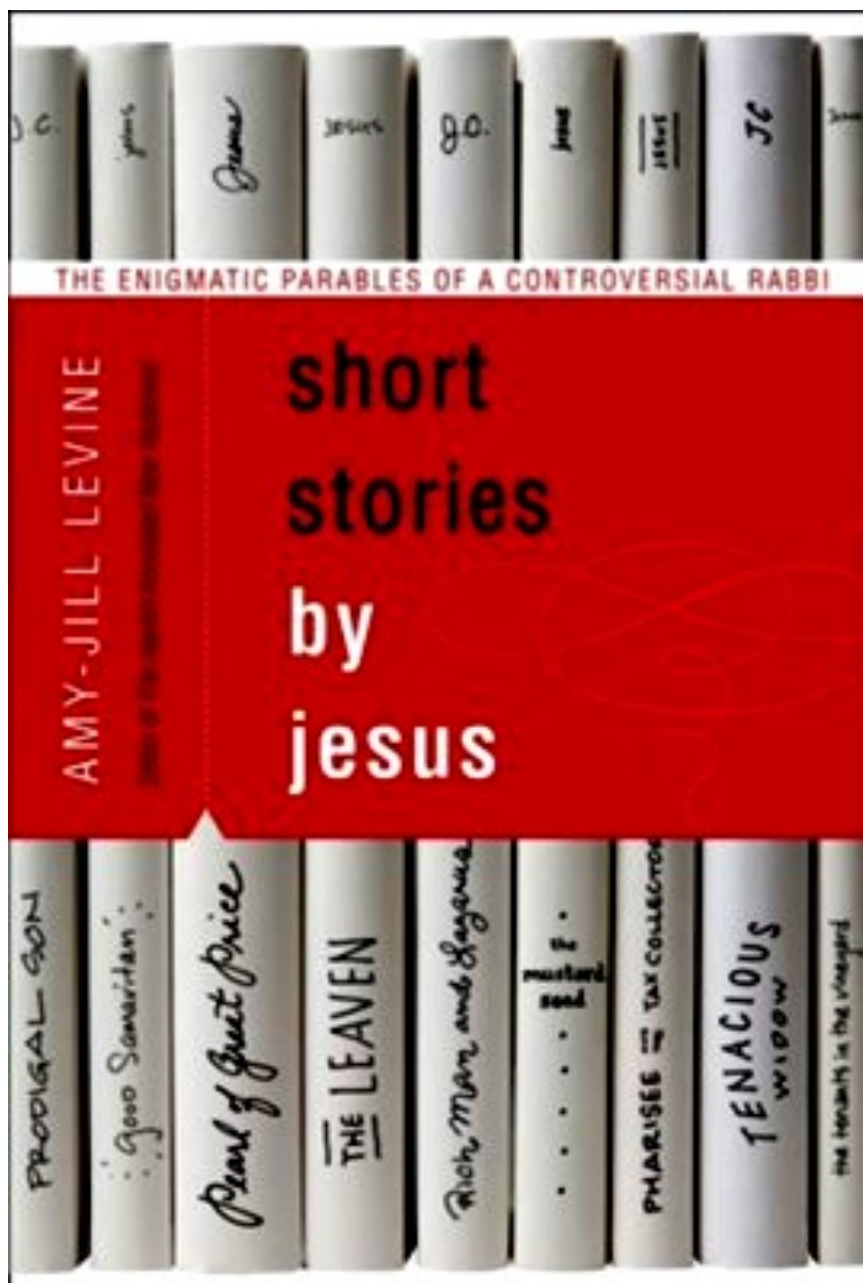
Join us at United In Christ for our upcoming Bible Study on Tuesday evenings beginning on February 20th at 6:30pm through the season of Lent! This year we will be journeying through the parables of Jesus alongside Dr. Amy Jill-Levine, the Rabbi Stanley M. Kessler Distinguished Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies at Hartford International University for Religion and Peace using her series: *Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi*. In the wake of an increase of anti-Semitism and islamophobia, the effects of which even felt here in the Susquehanna Valley, the interfaith voice that Dr. Jill-Levine brings to these stories from Jesus will be of tremendous value as we journey through the wilderness.

Each week will focus on a new parable with a short video and accompanying discussion guide. Copies of the participant guide are available through the church office for \$10/copy. Even without a copy of the guide, you are invited to join us at any point along the way for the study! Come and see!

### ***From the publisher:***

Jesus was a skilled storyteller and perceptive teacher who used parables from everyday life to effectively convey his message and meaning. Life in first-century Palestine was very different from our world today, and many traditional interpretations of Jesus' stories ignore this disparity and have often allowed anti-Semitism and misogyny to color their perspectives.

In *Short Stories by Jesus*, Amy-Jill Levine analyzes these "problems with parables" taking readers back in time to understand how their original Jewish audience understood them. With this revitalized understanding, she interprets these moving stories for the contemporary reader, showing how the parables are not just about Jesus, but are also about us—and when read rightly, still challenge and provoke us two thousand years later.

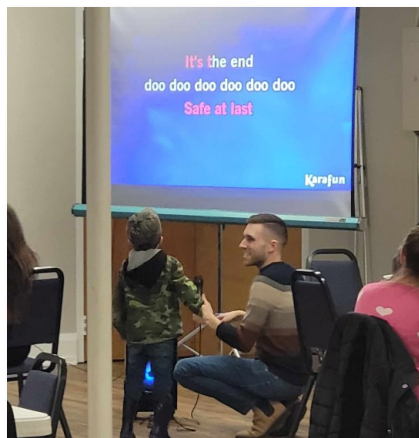

# YOUTH GROUP

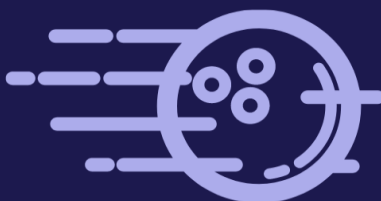


Youth Group is open to all students in grades 7-12 and typically runs for about two hours! Youth Group meets on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.

## Interested in joining a committee?

**FAITH & FUN:** Faith and Fun is committed to teaching our youngest youth (k-5) God's word by meeting after worship on Sunday's downstairs in our Youth Room.

**FELLOWSHIP:** The Fellowship Committee's role is to foster relationships within UIC by organizing events, like our upcoming Kids Night. These events are designed to build community among all of us, young and old. Fellowship also coordinates funeral luncheons that take place at UIC. Fellowship Committee meets on the 2nd Sunday every month in the meeting room across from the offices, directly after worship. **This committee could use some help!**

**FINANCE:** The Finance Committee's role is to oversee the finances and stewardship of UIC, by developing the annual budget, monitoring investments, develop and recommend financial policies to the Council.

**HOME COMMUNION:** The Home Communion Committee visits our homebound members, at least once a month, to give them communion.

**OAKS:** The OAKS Committee provides a monthly program for social interaction and community building for community senior citizens. OAKS coordinates presenters and education opportunities for participants. OAKS provides a nutritious lunch each month. OAKS Committee meets on the 2nd Tuesday every month from 10:00am - 1:00pm.

**OUTREACH:** Outreach provides service opportunities for us to serve those outside of our church, bridging the gap between community and church. Outreach meets on the first Sunday of the month in the meeting room across from the offices directly after worship.

**PROPERTY:** The Property Committee handles minor repairs to the church and property, and also oversees all other repairs that are done by outside vendors. This committee could use some help!!

**RICH HUFF:** The Rich Huff Committee runs the Baby Steps Diaper Pantry, gives out yearly scholarships to graduating area students, and helps children in need in our community.

**SENIOR EXPRESS:** Senior Express is a sub-committee under Outreach. The Committee delivers Central Pa Food Bank food boxes to area senior citizens in our area.

**WORSHIP AND MUSIC:** W&M Committee's role is to help facilitate and ensure faithful worship of God in proclamation of the Word and administration of the sacraments. W&M provides input to Pastor(s) and Music Director in shaping the course of Sunday morning worship/liturgy and tending to seasonal changes. W&M prepares the sanctuary with appropriate seasonal paraments, liturgical elements, and decoration for the church seasons and holidays.

- \_\_\_\_\_ **Altar Guild:** Altar Guild does not require a large time commitment but is vital. Responsibilities include setting up the elements of wine and bread before service & clean up after service. Altar Guild occasionally changes the altar and pulpit cloths as the church seasons change throughout the year. *(training available)*  
**People needed!**
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Bread/Wine:** A loaf of unsliced bread is brought to the church at least 30 minutes before service begins and \$5 is given for the purchase of communion wine.
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Communion Assistant:** Each service, three Communion Assistants assist the pastor in distributing communion wine and bread during communion. *(training available)*
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Digital Host:** The Digital Host holds the camera which streams worship. Don't worry the viewers can't hear you! We have separate mics that record the sound from up front.
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Guest Relations:** Guest Relations remains in the fellowship hall during worship incase a visitor needs assistance.
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Greeter:** Greeters are essential for providing a welcoming environment, handing out bulletins, and answering questions like where to find things in the building. There is 1 greeter at the side door and 2 at the front door, 2 in case 1 greeter gets busy talking to a newcomer or visitor. Having someone stationed at the doors to assist people can be the difference as to whether someone visits us again. Greeters arrive at church 30 minutes prior to worship.
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Lector:** Lector reads the 1st reading from the pulpit. The reading is emailed ahead of time so you can become familiar with it.
- \_\_\_\_\_ **Offering Counter:** A team of 2 counters prepare the deposit after each worship service. *(training available)*
