For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— not the result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.

Dear United In Christ,

You've heard about those viral do-gooders, right? You know, the ones who take their opportunity at the Starbucks (or Dunkin' or McDonald's) drive-thru window to pay for the order of the car that's behind them? It's a case of impromptu charity that often serves as a catalyst for a whole chain-reaction of altruistic endeavors. The first car pays for the car behind them, then that car pays for the one behind them, then that car pays for the one that's coming after; sometimes the system perpetuates itself over and over and over again a few dozen time, generally until it hits a mini-van full of Frappuccino orders and the driver at the window realizes they'd be paying \$67 for their \$3 black coffee.

But until that point, it's such a wonder-filled system of gratitude and service! People are genuinely so moved by the fact that the person ahead of them would anonymously show such a sign generosity that their day is brightened and they want to offer that same feeling to those who come next. They certainly don't owe the car ahead or behind anything – they could easily ride off with free drink in hand, after all – but they want to be a part of the cycle of service! The system is fueled by the grace of receiving a free gift and a deep yearning to share in the abundance of that gift with those who come next.*

Now I'm not saying that the Kingdom of God is like a Starbucks (a boy can only dream, right?), but perhaps there's more in common than we think. "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God" (Eph. 2:8). Like the first person who starts the chain reaction at the drive through, this life of faith and discipleship in Christ starts with a gift – albeit one far more valuable than my double shot of espresso. By grace, God looks to each of us out of God's great love and makes us alive in Christ – this is the course of faith through which we are saved! This beginning act of grace becomes the fertile ground in which new life takes root. By taking that which so many other have tried to earn and choosing to first offer it as a gift, God frees us from having to worry any further about where we stand in God's care!

In turn, this freedom is the new bedrock under our feet, yet that does not mean we ought to simply embrace a chaotic free-for-all. As Martin Luther reflects later in *The Freedom of a Christian*, this freedom now offers us the ability to go out and be of service to the neighbors who surround us. Having been made free and subject to *none*, we are free to render out service to *all*. Having received a course of freedom from the very start, we are free to pass it on down the line out of our deeply rooted spirit of gratitude!

See, this is what the course of freedom looks like. In this month when we mark the occasion of celebrating our nation's independence and the gifts and freedoms we enjoy as citizens, it often feels like we take this time to put our freedom front and center to demonstrate a voracious independence that relies on no one else and is primarily concerned with keeping a strict line of individual determination. In a way, we sometimes have a propensity of slipping into defending a freedom that is *only* self-serving in its course.

Yet, here is a reminder of what our freedom *ought* to resemble. True freedom, the freedom of *God's* kingdom, might just look more like that line at Starbucks than one of complete and total isolation of independence. Freedom in the kingdom sees *our* freedom as the exact cause for entering into the service of those placed around us, just as much as it is about relishing the joy that we have been gifted ourselves.

Later this month our day camp students as well as those heading to the National Youth Gathering will hear this freedom during day one of their experiences under the theme of "Created to be Free." As they take this grounding for their own experiences, may you know the same. You, too, are created to be free; free in grace, free in love, free in service. May you know such freedom in Christ this month and always.


