





# THE GREAT THANKSGIVING


The Lord be with you. And also with you.

as we forgive those who trespass against us;


and lead us not into temptation,


but deliver us from evil.

The body of Christ, given for you. The communicant may say: **Amen** 


The blood of Christ, shed for you. The communicant may say: **Amen**


