

"[Jesus] also told them a parable: "Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit? A disciple is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully qualified will be like the teacher. Why do you see the speck in your neighbor's eye, but do not notice the log in your own eye? Or how can you say to your neighbor, 'Friend, let me take out the speck in your eye,' when you yourself do not see the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your neighbor's eye."

Luke 6:39-42

Dear United In Christ,

You have heard it said:

- Don't throw stones in glass houses.
- If you point your finger, you have three pointing right back at you.
- I'm rubber, you're glue; whatever you say bounces off me and sticks to you.
- Or my personal favorite: look in the mirror, pal!

It's amazing how many idiomatic retorts we have for trying to *turn the tables* on someone in the midst of conversation, criticism, and accusation, isn't it? We've got so many creative and colorful ways to face down something being charged against us and try to *flip the script* on our accuser by levelling the very things they are laying out our feet right back at them! From the playground to the office to the halls of Congress, it seems as if we have all manner of means to dismiss criticism and go back on the attack at our accusers. With so many witty arrows in our quiver, it's no wonder that we walk around just a little bit guarded – as if we're always looking for the chance to fire back at those who come our way!

It's unfortunate, then, that Jesus' words here often get lumped into this armory. You've heard it right? Someone bears a charge or makes

a critical statement and the recipient fires back: "check the log in your own eye before you come after the speck in mine!" It's a way to try to get off the hook by pointing out the faults of the one coming at us in the first place! It's the uno-reverse card that tries to nullify any criticism by attacking the faults of the one bringing it to us.

But something tells me this isn't what Jesus had in mind when he offered these words. In the midst of the sermon entirely about how we see our neighbor and how we are called to interact with them (read the first parts of chapter 6), I don't think he is suddenly making a hard turn to give us ways to criticize those who are critical of us. Instead, Jesus is inviting the opportunity for deeper and far more meaningful self-reflection. He is asking his disciples to enter into a vulnerability that first asks what logs they have in eye that prevent them from seeing the world more clearly according to Jesus' own vision. It's an invitation to deep honesty that might be uncomfortable in what it reveals.

As we enter into the season of Lent this month, that same opportunity now presents itself to us. In this season of repentance, now is our opportunity to take our own inventory and ask where it is that *we* are the ones bearing ourselves in the wrong. In this season, can I take stock of what stones am *I* holding at the ready? What direction do I have *my* finger pointed in with more pointed back at me? Where am *I* the glue hurling insult across the way? What mirrors do *I* need to look long and hard into to see myself more clearly? *What logs are currently obstructing my own vision of the world*?

My prayer for you this season is that you might find the opportunity for such vulnerability. May you take this time in the wilderness ahead to ask after the hard truths in order to see the world around us more clearly with the vision of mercy and compassion that Christ asks of his disciples. May you remove logs from your eyes where you've been hunting for the specks in others.

But through it all, may you journey in the certainty of being seen most clearly by the one who looks to you in order to call you be-



loved. May you find your sure footing in the Jesus who embodies forgiveness beyond foibles and grace beyond guilt. May you move forward trusting that whatever it is you find in yourself along the way, the hope of new life and resurrection waits for you on the horizon. May you journey well!




