# FROM THE PASTOR



*A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever. Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him. He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.*

Isaiah 40:6-11

Dear United In Christ,

One of the more popular books in our house right now is Suzanne Lang's *Grumpy Monkey*. It's a children's story about a chimp who is *just not having it*. It starts off reading "One wonderful day, Jim Panzee woke to discover that nothing was right. The sun was too bright, the sky was too blue, and the bananas were too sweet." The rest of the story follows Jim as everyone in the jungle around him offers him suggestions on how to ditch his grumpiness to embrace the wonderful day at hand, but none prevail. Jim just needs to be grumpy!

Please tell me I'm not the only one who knows what it feels like to be in Jim's place. Surely you, too, must every now and again have one of *~those~* kinds of days. You know the kind; the ones where before your feet even hit the floor you already know that it's going to be a rough 24-hour cycle. The days where every step feels begrudging at best. The ones where checking the phone or read-

ing the paper or flipping on the news makes you want to just curl back up under the covers and call a redo. If you've ever had a day like this, then you don't need me to tell you what it feels like in the wilderness.

And if that's the case – if you know what those kind of days feel like – then maybe you resonate with the dreary sort of sentiment that the prophet Isaiah pens here: “All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass.” Not exactly a chipper sort of sentiment, is it? Speaking as one of God's attendees of the holy court, here the speaker betrays a sort of bleak view of humanity and its finitude. But maybe they're not the only one to carry such sentiment. Maybe, on those grumpiest most “nothing-is-right” sort of days you, too, feel that surely the people are grass.

Yet, from the top of that slippery slope of nihilistic gloom, a voice lifts up with strength. God here insists on a herald of good tidings even amid the bleak landscape that surrounds the people. God insists on telling the people something good, offering a promise of accompaniment as a shepherd gathers the flock for the sake of God's forlorn people. The insistence that God offers is that even amid the wilderness where it seems that things are only left to fade and wither, the word of God that leads on the mother sheep will stand fast for the people!


And listen, I get it. This Lent you may feel like the wilderness is already all around you – you don't need to enter a new one. Whether you are measuring personally, locally, nationally, or globally, you might feel like there is no way out of this wilderness landscape. But if that's the case, then it's all the better reason to plant those feet on the ground each morning and get up to a high mountain to hear this herald of good tidings. It's why this Lent we will gather for glimpses of such good tidings on a regular basis. With this season's worship series, “Tell Me Something Good,” we will work together to bear witness to such goodness brimming forth from God even amid the wildernesses

we have come to know. In those moments where it feels like we have woken up like Jim Panzee on a wonderful day to only discover that nothing is right, we will tell each other something good, trusting that the good news is yet breaking forth from God's goodness with each new step in this journey.

I hope you will join us in those opportunities to tell each other something good. Whether it's in study on Tuesdays, worship on Wednesdays, or gathered around the table on Thursdays (read on for more details about each of these opportunities), I hope you will find a place to hear good news even amid the wilderness this Lent. I hope that you will be the *bearers* of good tidings by telling the world something good around us (read on about how to do just that through DIG this Lent).

In the meantime, may you be blessed with the courage to plant those feet firmly, even on the days where hitting snooze feels like the preference. May you be blessed in the mountaintops breaking forth from the wilderness to herald God's goodness in this world. May your Lenten journey be one bearing both reflection and wholeness in the grace of God.

Join us this Lent as we center ourselves on a new worship series: *Tell Me Something Good: Grounding Ourselves in the Good News this Lent*. Join us for this series in worship on Sunday mornings as we move through our Lenten journey seeking out the good news, even in the wilderness. This year, we will be making this journey alongside our neighbors at Milton Luther-

an Church (MLC) and Christ's Evangelical Lutheran Church (CELC), as all three communities move through this series together!

As we lean into this year's theme, we invite you to join in three opportunities beyond Sunday morning worship to tell "something good" in the wilderness!

First, we invite you to join us for the opportunity to be told something good from new perspectives as we gather for mid-week worship. Beginning on **Wednesday, February 25<sup>th</sup>**, we invite you to join us weekly at CELC for a time of soup and fellowship at 6:00pm, followed by Holden Evening Prayer at 7:00pm in the sanctuary. Each week, we will hear "something good" from a lay leader from one of the three congregations. We hope you will come out to be renewed by the perspectives that bring!

Second, we invite you to join us for a new opportunity for gathering and digesting this good news during the week. Beginning on **Thursday, February 26<sup>th</sup>** at 11:00am, we invite you to join us weekly for food and fellowship at Silver Moon Restaurant! Each week, we will gather to reflect on the themes of that week and digest what was heard in worship on Sunday and Wednesday of the week prior!

### **About the Series:**

Lent was originally a season for new converts to learn and prepare for their baptism on Easter. During that time, they would study what was central to Christianity. As we crafted this se-

ries, we studied what was central to Jesus' life and ministry: radical welcome, love for neighbor, care for the vulnerable, nourishment for the hungry, nonviolence in the face of injustice. At the heart of Jesus' teachings, we find liberation, love, mercy, and grace—all of which are meant to be very good news for us all.

Jesus' ministry can be described as "radical" which comes from the Latin word "radicalis," meaning "root" or "ground." Therefore, the good news should bring us back to our roots. Emulating Jesus and embodying his teachings should ground us in who God created us to be. Can we be "good news" people in a world too often burdened by bad news?

This Lent, let us remember that the good news really is *good news*. It is joyful—like fine wine saved for celebration. It grows like a mustard seed and smells like perfume poured from an alabaster jar. It tastes like bread passed endlessly through a hungry crowd. It sounds like laughter and feels like mercy. The good news is alive in the world.


